The Georgia Department of Human Services' Division of Family and Children Services is at the forefront in the effort to promote adoption and was instrumental in finding families for more than 1,200 children in 2010; and

Despite the many adoption success stories, there are still hundreds of Georgia children that are waiting for permanent families so they, too, can have the guidance and security of a home of their own; now

THEREFORE:
