EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

- WHEREAS:** The State of Georgia holds title to certain real property by virtue of a condemnation judgment dated February 9, 1953, stamped with Secretary of State #000162, for approximately 126.4 acres (the "Property"); and
- WHEREAS:** Said Property is in the custody of the Department of Natural Resources (the "Department") and is operated as Indian Springs State Park; and
- WHEREAS:** The Property improvements include an approximate 5,000 square foot beach house, as shown in that aerial photograph attached hereto as Exhibit A, and incorporated herein by reference (the "Structure"); and
- WHEREAS:** Said Structure is identified by the Department to be in an unusable and abandoned state, and staff of the Department recommended the removal of the Structure; and
- WHEREAS:** The Board of Natural Resources on October 26, 2016, resolved to recommend the removal of the Structure and requested that the State Properties Commission seek an Executive Order from the Governor to allow for the razing, demolition, and disposal of the Structure as in the best interest of the State of Georgia; and
- WHEREAS:** The Department of Natural Resources has funding available to raze, demolish, and dispose of said Structure.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

- ORDERED:** The Department of Natural Resources is hereby authorized and directed to provide for the razing, demolition and disposal of said Structure under the terms and conditions which are deemed to be in the best interests of the State of Georgia.
