EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

FLAGS IN CHATHAM COUNTY, GEORGIA ORDERED LOWERED TO HALF-STAFF

- WHEREAS:** On May 25, 2018, Patrol Officer Anthony Christie, 37, was killed in the line of duty while assisting with traffic control following a vehicle accident; and
- WHEREAS:** Officer Christie joined the Savannah Police Department in December 2015 following 13 years of service in the U.S. Navy. He was a decorated war veteran, having received the Navy Achievement Medal, the Navy Good Conduct Medal, Global War on Terror Expeditionary Medal, and the Global War on Terror Service Medal; and
- WHEREAS:** It is fitting and proper to recognize Officer Christie's service to the citizens of Chatham County, the State of Georgia, and the United States of America.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN HONOR AND AS A MARK OF RESPECT FOR THE MEMORY OF OFFICER ANTHONY CHRISTIE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

- ORDERED:** That the flag of the United States and flag of the Great State of Georgia be flown at half-staff in Chatham County, Georgia, on Saturday, June 2, 2018, the day of Officer Christie's honor procession, until sunset.
