

# THE STATE OF GEORGIA

## EXECUTIVE ORDER

### BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS:

The Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) Act (Pub. L. No. 112-141, 126 Stat. 405) requires that the Secretary of Transportation manage programs to address national priorities for reducing highway deaths and injuries; and

WHEREAS:

Section 405(d) of MAP-21 authorizes the Secretary of Transportation to award grants to states that adopt and implement effective programs to reduce driving under the influence of alcohol and drugs; and

WHEREAS:

The State of Georgia is currently in its first year of receiving a grant under Section 405(d) of MAP-21; and

WHEREAS:

Eligibility of the State of Georgia to receive funding from this grant requires that the state convene a task force to develop a statewide plan to address the problem of impaired driving during the first year of the grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

**ORDERED:** 

That there shall be formed an Impaired Driving Task Force (the "Task Force"), which shall be chaired by the Director of the Governor's Office of Highway Safety and shall consist of the following additional members:

- The Division Director of Law Enforcement Services of the Governor's Office of Highway Safety,
- The Commissioner of the Department of Transportation or his designee,
- The Commissioner of the Department of Driver's Service or his designee,
- The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety or his designee,

- The Executive Director of the Prosecuting Attorney's Council or his designee,
- The Commissioner of the Department of Corrections or his designee,
- The Commissioner of the Department of Public Health or her designee,
- The State Judicial Outreach Liaison,
- A representative of a Georgia Drug Court,
- A representative of the Ignition Interlock Industry,
- A representative of the Communications Division of the Governor's Office of Highway Safety,
- The Traffic Records Project Manager within the Governor's Office of Highway Safety,
- The Executive Director of Georgia Sheriff's Association, and
- The Executive Director of Georgia Police Chief's Association.

#### IT IS FURTHER

**ORDERED:** 

That the Task Force shall develop a statewide impaired driving plan to provide a comprehensive strategy for preventing and reducing impaired driving behavior.

## IT IS FURTHER

**ORDERED:** 

That the Task Force shall convene no later than August 9, 2013, and submit its statewide plan to the Governor no later than September 1, 2013.
