BY THE GOVERNOR:

FLAGS ON ALL STATE BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS **ORDERED LOWERED TO HALF-STAFF**

Fifteen years ago our nation was struck by tragedy when thousands of our own were WHEREAS: mindlessly lost at the behest of a hateful and heartless ideal; and

As we continue to move forward in an attempt to mend the wounds suffered on that day, WHEREAS: we must recognize that these efforts will never be fulfilled; our nation and the world was

forever changed on that September morning; and

We can never replace those who perished, we will continue to remember and honor their WHEREAS:

lives and lift up the families and friends of those who were lost; and

We must continue to remember in our prayers the men and women of our armed forces WHEREAS:

who are stationed around the world, protecting our country from future terroristic threats;

and

To honor the memories of those who lost their lives and memorialize this day in our WHEREAS:

nation's history, the United States Congress on December 18, 2001, passed by joint resolution Public Law 107-89, which designates September 11 of each year as "Patriot

Now, therefore, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of

THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: That the State of Georgia recognize Sunday, September 11, 2016, as Patriot Day by flying

the American Flag and the flag of the Great State of Georgia at half-staff on all state buildings and grounds. I also encourage all Georgians to display the American Flag and

the flag of the Great State of Georgia at half-staff from their homes and businesses.

IT IS FURTHER

That all Georgians are called upon to observe Friday, September 9 through Sunday, **ORDERED:**

> September 11, 2016, as National Days of Prayer and Remembrance to honor and remember the victims, their loved ones, and those who continue to protect our freedom.
