EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

FLAGS ON STATE CAPITOL BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS ORDERED LOWERED TO HALF STAFF

WHEREAS: A half century ago, the United States of America turned its attention to Dallas, Texas as it mourned the loss of an extraordinary public servant; and

WHEREAS: In his three years as President, John F. Kennedy weathered the perilous tests of the Cold War and ushered in a new wave of American diplomacy during the Cuban Missile Crisis; and

WHEREAS: While President Kennedy's life was tragically cut short, his legacy of service continues to inspire all Americans and Georgians; and

WHEREAS: It is fitting and proper to honor and remember President Kennedy's life on this American Day of Remembrance.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN HONOR AND AS A MARK OF RESPECT FOR THE MEMORY OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: That the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Georgia be flown at half-staff on the State Capitol building and grounds on Friday, November 22, 2013, until sunset.
