FLAGS ON ALL STATE BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS ORDERED LOWERED TO HALF STAFF

Today, the citizens of state of Georgia and the United States of America, mourn the WHEREAS:

loss of George Herbert Walker Bush, the 41st President of the United States. President George H. W. Bush served as president from 1989-1993 following service as the 43rd Vice President, congressman, ambassador, and the 11th director of the

Central Intelligence Agency.

Born in Milton, Massachusetts, he first answered his call to public service when he WHEREAS:

suspended his attendance at Yale University to voluntarily enlist in the U.S. Navy

as an aviator during World War II; and

George H. W. Bush served as the President of the United States of America with WHEREAS:

great honor and distinction, advancing the cause of freedom to every corner of the

world; and

President George H. W. Bush will be remembered as an honored veteran, WHEREAS:

statesman, and civil servant of the highest order for his leadership and service to

the United States of America.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN HONOR OF AND AS A MARK OF RESPECT FOR THE MEMORY OF PRESIDENT GEORGE H. W. BUSH, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY

VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

That the flag of the United States and the flag of the Great State of Georgia shall be **ORDERED:**

flown at half-staff on all state buildings and grounds for 30 days beginning Saturday, December 1, 2018, and shall remain lowered until sunset on Sunday,

December 30, 2018.
