A PROCLAMATION

ATAXIA AWARENESS DAY

- WHEREAS: Ataxia is a lack of muscular coordination, which due to a number of related neurological disorders causes progressive deterioration of nerve cells in the spinal cord and cerebellum, the coordination center of the brain; and
- WHEREAS: Ataxia is due to a gene passed from generation to generation, either as a dominant or recessive trait. Symptoms can occur at any age, but most often in ages 20 through 40 when dominant and during the teen years when recessive; and
- WHEREAS: Symptoms include a stumbling walk, hand incoordination and slurred speech. Symptoms progress over a period of 10 to 20 years, and patients may be confined to a wheelchair; and
- WHEREAS: An estimated 150,000 individuals are affected by hereditary ataxia and sporadic ataxia in the United States. Ataxia can affect anyone at any time, without regard to age, sex or race. Since there is no known cure, the only defense is research and prevention through education; now
- THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 25, 2014, as ATAXIA AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 9th day of September in the year of our Lord two thousand fourteen.
