## A PROCLAMATION BUSINESS CYBERSECURITY DAY

WHEREAS:

The Technology Association of Georgia, the Georgia Department of Defense, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Georgia Bureau of Investigation, Cobb County 9–1–1, Cobb County Police and Cyber Exercises will conduct the open 2014 Cyber Security Simulation at Clay National Guard Center to build cooperation and government–enterprise partnership, preparing Georgia businesses to react quickly and with a minimum of damage to the inevitable cyber challenges that lie ahead; and
