WHEREAS: Central Service Department tasks include decontaminating, cleaning,

processing, assembling, sterilizing, storing, and distributing the medical

devices and supplies needed for patient care; and

WHEREAS: The Central Service Department of a health care facility is the heart of all

activity surrounding instruments, supplies, and equipment required for operating rooms, endoscopy suites, an ICU, birth centers, and other

patient care areas; and

WHEREAS: Central service technicians play a most important role in patient care

arenas and are responsible for first-line processes to prevent patient

infections; and

WHEREAS: Central Service Week affords us an opportunity to recognize the

contribution central service technicians make to patient safety and the

opportunities and challenges faced by those in the profession; now

THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

October 11-17, 2015, as CENTRAL SERVICE WEEK in Georgia.
