A PROCLAMATION

CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

- WHEREAS: More than 15,000 children are diagnosed with cancer in the United States every year, and one in 285 kids will be diagnosed with cancer by the time they turn 20. Cancer is the leading cause of death by disease among children between infancy and age 15; and
- WHEREAS: Each year, hundreds of children in Georgia face the battle against cancer – a battle which impacts parents, grandparents, loved ones, friends, neighbors, and communities. One in five of our nation's children loses his or her battle with cancer, and many infants, children, and teens will suffer from long-term effects of comprehensive treatment, including secondary cancers; and
- WHEREAS: September has been set aside as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month to increase awareness about the issue of childhood cancer, including the need for early detection, prompt treatment, research, and attention to the late term effects of treatment on childhood cancer survivors; and
- WHEREAS: Several health care professionals, researchers, private philanthropies, and social support organizations are dedicated to helping children and their families by offering social, emotional, spiritual, educational, and financial support; and
- WHEREAS: These groups are committed to increasing awareness for this cause which will lead to increased knowledge and support for families who have been affected by cancer. We are thankful for all that they do to educate the public about childhood cancer; now
- THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 2015 as CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
