

House Bill 384 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend an Act consolidating the offices of tax collector and tax receiver into the office of
2 tax commissioner of Cobb County, approved February 17, 1949 (Ga. L. 1949, p. 790), as
3 amended, particularly by an Act approved May 12, 2008 (Ga. L. 2008, p. 3725) and an Act
4 approved May 12, 2015 (Ga. L. 2015, p. 4046), so as to change the compensation of certain
5 employees of such office; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 An Act consolidating the offices of tax collector and tax receiver into the office of tax
9 commissioner of Cobb County, approved February 17, 1949 (Ga. L. 1949, p. 790), as
10 amended, particularly by an Act approved May 12, 2008 (Ga. L. 2008, p. 3725) and an Act
11 approved May 12, 2015 (Ga. L. 2015, p. 4046), is amended by revising Section 3 as follows:

12 "SECTION 3.

13 (a) The tax commissioner shall receive a minimum annual salary as provided by Code
14 Section 48-5-183 of the O.C.G.A. plus a supplement in the amount of \$18,001.39, to be
15 paid in equal monthly installments from county funds. The tax commissioner shall be
16 allowed one chief clerk whose annual salary shall be paid in equal monthly installments
17 from the funds of the county treasury. The annual salary for the chief clerk shall be
18 \$112,983.32. Any candidate for the office of tax commissioner of Cobb County shall, on
19 the date of qualifying for such office in either a primary or a general election, certify to the
20 judge of the Probate Court of Cobb County the name of the person the candidate shall
21 appoint as chief clerk in the event he or she is elected to the office of tax commissioner of
22 Cobb County; and the person so named shall serve as the chief clerk during the term for
23 which he or she was so named. In the event of the death or removal from office of said
24 chief clerk, the tax commissioner of Cobb County shall have 30 days from said date of

25 death or removal from office of said chief clerk to certify to the judge of the Probate Court
26 of Cobb County the name of the chief clerk to be appointed.

27 (b) In addition to those employees provided for in subsection (a) of this section, there is
28 created the position of executive secretary to the tax commissioner. The executive
29 secretary shall be appointed by the tax commissioner, shall be under the tax commissioner's
30 direct supervision and control, and shall serve at the pleasure of the tax commissioner. The
31 tax commissioner shall establish such qualifications, education, and experience as he or she
32 deems necessary for the individual appointed to the position of executive secretary. The
33 salary of the executive secretary shall be \$62,159.19 per annum, to be paid in equal
34 monthly installments from the funds of Cobb County.

35 (c) In addition to those employees provided for in subsections (a) and (b) of this section,
36 there is created the position of administrative specialist in the office of the tax
37 commissioner. The administrative specialist shall be appointed by the tax commissioner,
38 shall be under the tax commissioner's direct supervision and control, and shall serve at the
39 pleasure of the tax commissioner. The tax commissioner shall establish such
40 qualifications, education, and experience as he or she deems necessary for the individual
41 appointed to the position of administrative specialist. The salary of the administrative
42 specialist shall be \$62,159.19 per annum, to be paid in equal monthly installments from the
43 funds of Cobb County."

44 **SECTION 2.**

45 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
