

House Bill 784 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 40-2-86 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 special license plates promoting and supporting certain beneficial projects, causes, agencies,
3 funds, or nonprofit corporations, so as to establish a specialty license plate to promote the
4 conservation and enhancement of waterfowl populations and their habitats; to provide for
5 related matters; to provide for an effective date; to provide for compliance with constitutional
6 requirements; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
7 purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

10 Code Section 40-2-86 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to special license
11 plates promoting and supporting certain beneficial projects, causes, agencies, funds, or
12 nonprofit corporations, is amended by adding a new paragraph to subsection (n) to read as
13 follows:

14 "(7) A special license plate promoting the conservation and enhancement of waterfowl
15 populations and their habitats. The funds raised by the sale of this special license plate
16 shall be disbursed to the Wildlife Resources Division of the Department of Natural
17 Resources for the purposes of waterfowl habitat restoration, waterfowl research, and
18 waterfowl management programs."

19 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 2.**

20 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2019.

21 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 3.**

22 In accordance with the requirements of Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI(n) of the
23 Constitution of the State of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the
24 requisite two-thirds' majority vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
