## A PROCLAMATION KINSHIP CARE MONTH

WHEREAS: The State of Georgia is dedicated to ensuring that its children and youth

grow in stable households that provide a nurturing and comforting

environment; and

WHEREAS: More than 2.7 million Kinship care households reside in the United States.

These families are composed of blood and non-blood relatives who have taken on the role as the primary caregiver after a life-altering occasion;

and

WHEREAS: More than 250,000 of Georgia's grandparents live with their grandchildren

despite older relative caregivers being significantly more likely to have a

disability and face economic hardship; and

WHEREAS: Georgia offers many services to Kinship residents, including legal,

financial, and medical assistance; child care; support groups; respite care;

and educational resources; and

WHEREAS: In Kinship care, the child benefits greatly but through the unselfish

dedication of the caregiver, the state profits as well. Kinship caregivers are key in the prevention of foster care placements and therefore save the

state valuable resources; now

THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

September 2015 as KINSHIP CARE MONTH in Georgia in an effort to celebrate Kinship and encourage Georgia's citizens to recognize and

appreciate the commitment and sacrifices of these families.
