## **A PROCLAMATION**

## PANCREATIC CANCER AWARENESS DAY

- WHEREAS: In 2015, an estimated 48,960 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the U.S., 40,560 will die from the disease, and approximately 1,040 of those deaths will occur in Georgia; and
- WHEREAS: Pancreatic cancer, one of the deadliest cancers, is currently the fourth leading cause of cancer death in the U.S. and is projected to become the second by 2020. It is the only major cancer with a five year relative survival rate at seven percent; and
- WHEREAS:73 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year of their<br/>diagnosis while 93 percent of patients die within the first five years; and
- WHEREAS: Pancreatic cancer is the seventh most common cause of cancer related death in men and women across the world; and
- WHEREAS: The health and well-being of the citizens of Georgia are enhanced as a result of increased awareness of pancreatic cancer and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments; now
- THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim November 13, 2015, as PANCREATIC CANCER AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 26<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year of our Lord two thousand fifteen.
