A PROCLAMATION SYRINGOMYELIA AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: First discovered in 1803, Syringomyelia, also known as SM, is a rare

chronic spinal and neurological progressive disease of the spinal cord. There are two major types of SM: Chiari Malformation which occurs during fetal development and trauma in which symptoms can occur many years

later; and

WHEREAS: Syringomyelia occurs when fluid found outside the spinal cord and brain

enters the interior spinal cord forming a cavity known as syrinx. Over time, this disorder can cause damage to the spinal cord, neurological issues,

severe pain, and serious disabling symptoms; and

WHEREAS: Thousands of men, women, and children, as well as canines, throughout

the nation have been plagued by the widespread physical symptoms

associated with Syringomyelia; and

WHEREAS: There is currently only limited treatment and no cure for patients with this

disease as well as a lack of knowledge in the general public and medical

community; and

WHEREAS: It is imperative that we increase awareness of this disease in order to

improve the quality of life for all those who struggle with this debilitating

disorder; now

THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May

2015 as SYRINGOMYELIA AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
