There are over 200 million adults over the age of 25 in the United States and approximately 15 percent have not earned a high school diploma or an

equivalent; and

WHEREAS:

Because strong schools are the only proven route to tomorrow's good jobs, Georgia must focus efforts on producing well-prepared students who are

life-, college- and work-ready; and

WHEREAS:

Georgia students, consistent with the nation as a whole, have lost ground to global peers and now sit in the middle of the pack when it comes to overall student achievement. Georgia must increase thoroughness and ensure that our requirements truly prepare students to compete nationally

and internationally; and

WHEREAS:

Because the state bears a responsibility to ensure that our students get their best shot at a good education, Georgia joined 41 other states in adopting Common Core State Standards which will help define what our students need to know, increase rigor, and provide a tool to measure our students against their peers.
