A PROCLAMATION ARTHROGRYPOSIS AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS:

Arthrogryposis Multiplex Congenita (AMC) is a condition that causes one's joints to

be stiff and crooked at birth; and

WHEREAS:

Arthrogryposis is an umbrella diagnosis, meaning that it is a part of other conditions and syndromes. There are more than 400 different types of AMC of which

Amyoplasia, Distal Escobar Syndrome is the most common; and

WHEREAS:

A newborn with arthrogryposis lacks the normal range of motion in one or more joints. This condition develops prenatally and can be caused by an underlying

condition or syndrome; and

WHEREAS:

A newborn must have three contracted joints in two different areas of the body to be diagnosed with arthrogryposis. This occurs in approximately 1 in 3,000 births;

and

WHEREAS:

Joints that can be affected by AMC include hands, feet, hips, knees, elbows, shoulders, wrists, fingers, toes, jaw, and spine. Though any joint can be affected, some may be unaffected as no two individuals experience the exact same

symptoms; and

WHEREAS:

Although arthrogryposis is not curable, it is treatable. Treatment goals aim to allow those living with the condition with as much independence in their daily lives as possible; now

THEREFORE:

I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim June 30, 2018, as ARTHROGRYPOSIS AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.
