A PROCLAMATION ASIAN/PACIFIC AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS: Asian/Pacific Americans are among those who have influenced our country for

the better. Their achievements have greatly enriched our quality of life and

helped to determine the future course of our state and our nation; and

WHEREAS: Chinese immigrants were productive and resourceful contributors to a

multitude of industries and businesses. Laboring under very difficult conditions, they helped construct the western half of the first transcontinental railroad. Their hard work was invaluable in linking together the East and West coasts, thus vastly expanding economic growth and development across the

country; and

WHEREAS: Over time, other immigrants journeyed to America from East Asia, Southeast

Asia, and the Asian Subcontinent. Today, Georgia has the second fastest

growing Asian American population in the United States; and

WHEREAS: During the observance of Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month, we celebrate

the cultural traditions, ancestry, native languages and unique experiences represented among the more than 30 ethnic groups from Asia and the Pacific found here in the United States. We also recognize millions of Asian/Pacific Americans whose hard work and love of family and community have helped

unite us as a people and sustain us as a nation; now
