A PROCLAMATION

ASSISTANCE DOG WEEK

- WHEREAS: Assistance dogs transform the lives of their human partners by providing specific services that support an individual's physical or mental disabilities; and
- WHEREAS: Assistance dogs serve as devoted companions, helpers, aides, best friends, and close family members; and
- WHEREAS: Assistance dogs include guide dogs, hearing dogs, service dogs, seizure alert dogs, and medical alert and medical response dogs. These animals are essential in providing individuals affected by disabilities with opportunities to maintain safe and independent lives; and
- WHEREAS: Guide dogs assist individuals who are blind or visually-impaired by guiding them safely around physical obstacles and directing them to various destinations, such as available seating, crosswalks, elevators, and stairways. Hearing dogs alert individuals with hearing loss to the presence of specific sounds that are necessary for everyday safety and comfort, such as doorbells, telephones, sirens, and smoke or fire alarms; and
- WHEREAS: Service dogs are individually trained to assist those with various disabilities by performing certain difficult tasks for the owner, such as retrieving and carrying items, opening doors and drawers, and pushing buttons. Seizure alert dogs alert their owner and others to medical conditions, such as seizures and epilepsy, and help to relieve an owner's dizziness, balance problems, or chronic pain; and
- WHEREAS: Medical alert and medical response dogs alert or respond to oncoming medical conditions, such as a stroke, panic attack, anxiety attack, blood sugar warnings, epilepsy, and post-traumatic stress disorder; and
- WHEREAS: Assistance dogs offer individuals the ability to address and potentially overcome disability-related limitations. They are devoted partners and companions whose service helps to ensure an owner's overall health and well-being; and

- WHEREAS: International Assistance Dog Week presents an opportunity to raise awareness of the services provided by assistance dogs and recognize their vital role in helping those with disabilities overcome daily struggles and maintain self-sufficient lifestyles; now
- THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim August 5-11, 2018, as ASSISTANCE DOG WEEK in Georgia.
