public about the dangers of substance abuse; and

WHEREAS: Alcohol and Drug Addiction Recovery Month raises awareness for people

who are currently working to overcome addictions through treatment, in

addition to their families, friends, supporters, and treatment providers; now

THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

them with assistance and motivation along their journey.
